FROM YOUR HANDICRAFT COORDINATOR, MARILYN WATTENBARGER:

The time is fast approaching where our outside activities will probably be lessened. There have been some changes to the handicraft for forthcoming "Handicraft Competition 2020". Mainly in knitting and crocheting. Seems so long away but it will be here soon. I encourage everyone to find at least one competition category that they can enter.

These changes as well as an updated Handicraft List will be emailed to your Branches' email contact person.

Please ensure that all articles coming into the competition have a blue tag showing the category that they should be entered in. Some articles did not have this last year. I will not put tags on any article going forward. Please read the requirements for each class and make sure your entry fits into this description. Also, please ladies, any article presented for judging must be completed since the last competition i.e. June 2019 and be completed by yourself following the guidelines in the Handicraft List.

Each Branch can only enter into one category, not each member. When compiling your information to send to me, please ensure that all entries are listed alphabetically and numerically following the Handicraft list. Example: A-1 thru A-7, B-3 thru B-4, C-1 thru C-10 and so on continuously. Do not place B's items before A's. Do not make a page for each member. This enables a Branch to make sure that there are no duplicate category items. It also makes it much easier for checking items in and out, and to record points for the Branch. There will be no acceptance for commercially produced items.

Happy stitching and the many other ways to do other handicrafts and photography. If you have any questions or comments my information is listed in Handicraft List.
