UPDATE FROM HANDICRAFT COORDINATOR

In addition to the Handicraft entry items are two special categories.



One is the Edna May Ridley Quilting Award. This is a hand quilted patchwork quilt. The top of the quilt may be machine pieced but the quilt must be hand quilted. Minimum size is 40x60 inches. The First class winner in Class D-1 automatically wins this award. The winner will receive a small individual plaque and her name will be placed on the large plaque held by Alberta Women's Institutes.



The second is the Myrtle (Olsen Roberts) Heyer Doily Award. The article in this category may be either of the three: tatted doily 10" – 14", crochet doily 14" – 30", knitted doily 14" – 30". The material used must be Crochet cotton.

In this category each member from every branch or associate member can enter. Do not mount doilies. The first place winner will receive a small individual plaque and have her name engraved on the large plaque held by Alberta Women's Institutes. There will be no points awarded for this class and therefore no points towards branch standings.



A new Handicraft List 2023 will be out soon. There have been many changes – additions, deletions, and changes in wording to some Classes.

Please check the list carefully so that all your entries are entered into the appropriate class. Please note Page 2 #13: There will be no articles accepted for display only. This and all disqualified articles will be placed into respective branch tubs and not displayed.
